

## Resources for New Hanover County

Three Points of Distribution Sites, better known as PODS, offer Meals Ready to Eat (MREs), water and tarps to residents of New Hanover County (including the beach towns) and the City of Wilmington. The North and Central locations will both close at noon Monday and not reopen. The South location will close at 7 p.m. Monday and noon on Tuesday after which it will be closed thereafter.

- **North POD location:** College Park Elementary School, 5301 Sidbury Road, Castle Hayne, North Carolina, 28429 (Monday, Sept. 24, 7 a.m. to noon)
- **Central POD location:** Veteran's Park, 840 Halyburton Memorial Parkway, Wilmington. North Carolina, 28412 (Monday, Sept. 24, 7 a.m. to noon)
- **South POD location:** Cape Fear Community College downtown campus (700 North Front Street, Wilmington, North Carolina, 28401 (Monday, Sept 24, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.; Tuesday, Sept. 25, 7 a.m. to noon)

**Diamond Food Catering, partnering with World Central Kitchen:** Individuals and families that need a meal plus some food to go home with can go to the following locations:

- BBQ Relief at the old k-mart parking lot

**MedNorth:** Has a mobile medical unit provided by United Health Care. Currently located at MedNorth. They have 3 exam rooms, offering FREE services by 2 Nurse Practitioners and 1 behavioral social worker.

**Disability Resource Center:** offers long-term equipment needs to people with significant disabilities, i.e., wheelchairs, hearing aids, batteries, etc. Their services cover all 5 counties. **Wilmington Area Rebuilding Ministry (WARM):** Can help with putting tarps on homes that have damage. Contact is Joe Finley at WARM.
